The following patients should be referred very urgently, to be seen within 48 hours and recommended practice is to contact the on-call paediatrician rather than using the 2WW pathway.

Neuroblastoma
palpable abdominal mass or unexplained enlarged abdominal organ
Wilms' tumour
palpable abdominal mass unexplained visible haematuria
an unexplained enlarged abdominal organ
Brain and central nervous system cancers
newly abnormal cerebellar or other central neurological function (Red flag as recommended on <a href="http://www.headsmart.org.uk">http://www.headsmart.org.uk</a> )
Hodgkin's & Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma
unexplained lymphadenopathy unexplained splenomegaly
Soft Tissue Sarcoma
Ultrasound scan findings that are suggestive of soft tissue sarcoma Proptosis
Leukaemia
unexplained petechiae, pallor or hepatosplenomegaly
Bone sarcoma
X-ray suggests the possibility of bone sarcoma
Retinoblastoma
consider referring children with absent red reflex
